





# NEW | ELECTRONIC TRAVEL AUTHORISATION (ETA)

REQUIRED FOR EU NATIONALS TO TRAVEL TO THE UK FROM 2ND APRIL 2025





#### What is an Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) and who needs it?

An ETA is **an advance travel permission** required for specific <u>non-visa nationals</u> who are visiting the UK, transiting through, or seeking entry to the UK as a Creative Worker.

This includes all Permitted Activities as per <u>Appendix Permitted Activities</u> which a Visitor is allowed to conduct in the UK, examples of which are: **tourism / leisure** as well as visits for **business reasons**, such as meetings, events, seminars, or other work commitments.

Foreign nationals with leave to enter; leave to remain; or indefinite leave to remain in the UK are not required to obtain an ETA.

## When will it be required?

European nationals, including Spaniards, will need an ETA to travel to the UK from **2**<sup>nd</sup> **April 2025**. Applications can be made from **5**<sup>th</sup> **March 2025**.

Other nationalities may require an ETA before these dates. Please check if this applies to you.

#### How can I apply?

The UK Home Office recommends using the 'UK ETA' app: APP STORE | GOOGLE PLAY

A browser version is also available.

Cost: the application costs £10 per person

#### What do you need to apply?

- Your original passport
- An email address
- A form of online payment

#### How do I apply through the app?

- You will need to take a picture of your passport, scan the passport, and provide your biometrics.
- Then, you will answer some questions about your address, job and criminal history.

## Getting a decision

You will receive a decision within 3 working days.

Once you have received your ETA, this will be linked to your passport digitally.

Your ETA will last for two years, and it is a multi-travel permission, but you will be required to renew it if your passport expires or any details on it change.

# Examples

- A Spanish client is travelling from Madrid for a meeting at your offices in London in May > an ETA will be required.
- A Spanish professional with a work visa in the UK is returning from a holiday in Mallorca > an ETA will not be required due to the work visa.
